LHA1	Telephone Box, Victoria Road Map ref SX 874512.			*				*	*	One of three surviving telephone boxes located in Dartmouth. The other two are listed. There are plans to use these surviving boxes for housing defibrillators.
LHA2	Lower Ferry, Bayards Cove Map ref SX 878510.			*			*		*	The ferry has been transporting vehicles and foot passengers between Dartmouth and Kingswear since the 1700s. The Ferry is operated using a floating platform pushed along by a tug.
LHA3	The Dartmouth Visitor Centre Map ref SX 886502			*			*	*	*	Provides a vital role in the town's tourism infrastructure. Situated in Mayor's Avenue car park, the centre also provides home to the first atmospheric steam engine invented by local man Thomas Newcomen in 1712.
LHA4	Pony Hoops, Crowther's Hill Map ref SX 876512.			*			*			These iron pony hoops are embedded in the stone wall at the beginning of Crowther's Hill. Historically one of the main pedestrian and livestock route into Dartmouth.
LHA5	Control Tower, Townstal Road Map ref SX 861509.			*				*		In the early 1960's the Navy constructed a hangar on this site and set up a small helicopter facility. The small control tower was built at a later date. The hangar was demolished by 1999 but the Control Tower remains.

LHA6	Water Tower, Jawbones Hill Map ref SX 871505.			*			*		Concrete water tower, Jawbones Hill serves as a valuable landmark and starting point for walkers and ramblers. The tower marks the entrance to Beacon Park and waymark on the "Diamond Jubilee Way."	
LHA7	Armada Memorial Beacon, Jawbones Hill Map ref SX 871506.						*	*	The Armada Memorial Beacon was erected in 1988 at the edge of Beacon Park. It is well placed to be seen from all of Dartmouth	
LHA8	Crosby Meadow, Waterpool Road Map ref SX 874511					*		*	Crosby Meadow owned by the Dartmouth Trust is popular with dog walkers or as a place for peace and contemplation with extensive views over the town. Often a welcome resting point for those walking up Waterpool Road.	
LHA9	Historic Walls of Dartmouth. (Various locations).			*			*	*	Outside of the Dartmouth Conservation area are numerous historic walls with townscape importance.	
LHA10	Coronation Park Map ref SX 879517.					*		*	Coronation Park was opened in 1937 built on reclaimed land. The park overlooks the river and Embankment. The open playing fields are an ideal place for picnics, to enjoy park games or hold outdoor events.	
LHA11	Cottage Hospital. South Embankment Map ref SX 878512.						*	*	*	Hospital was founded 1887 to commemorate Queen Victoria's Jubilee. The original hospital building on this site (now within the Dartmouth Conservation area) was erected in 1892 and extended in 1926. The hospital is now closed and the future use remains uncertain.
